During the review meeting of training activities held on 23.09.10 at New Delhi, it was found that a few States have not yet started the training programme and formation of Core Groups at the States, District and Block levels under the Lab-to-Land initiative. The following milestones have been fixed for Lab-to-Land initiative which may be adhered to :

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 USCRPS

- i) Set up Core Groups at State, District and Block levels for coordination
- ii) Issue letter to the concerned District Collector, Line Departments and Banks about the implementation of the initiative
- iii) Identification of nodal persons in each department (agriculture, fisheries, animal husbandry, health, nutrition, PDS, etc.)
- iv) BDO to be trained as the Chief Block Coordinator
- v) Initiation meeting with stakeholders at the block level to be chaired by DC
- vi) Orientation of officials, PRIs, SHGs, community resource institutions / persons on thematic issues
- vii) Finalization of objectives, actions, indicators, targets
- viii) Prioritization and scheduling of actions
- ix) Sharing of action plan with CRPs and the community
- x) Setting up of a community radio
- xi) Use of Cultural troops, Development Rath, IEC Vans, pamphlets, leaflets
- xii) Request DFP /SDD of Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Government of India for support
- xiii) Documentation of the experience and process

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2. It is reiterated that under this initiative a joint endeavour has to be made for ensuring full achievement of objectives of all the Schemes being implemented in the Block covering sectors such as rural development, panchayati raj, health, nutrition, education, rural electrification, agricultural, animal husbandry, fisheries, forests and environment, etc. All the Line departments and the banks have to be sensitized accordingly during the Committee meetings. SIRDs will provide training and act as a facilitator in the whole process. Resources available under the ongoing programmes will be utilized under this initiative as has been done in Orissa, Madhya Pradesh and Andhra Pradesh.
